Stan Smith is a legend of his sport, not only for the myriad of tennis titles on his resume, but also for the legacy of sportsmanship and courtesy he gave his profession and which he continues to exude today. Smith was the No. 1 player in the world and dominated tennis in the early 1970's, winning the US Open in 1971 and Wimbledon in 1972. He is also a 7-time winner of the Davis Cup and currently serves as the President of the International Tennis Hall of Fame.
